### Recipe of the Month - Roasted Butternut Squash

- 1 Butternut Squash-peeled, seeded and cut into 1 inch cubes 2 TBSP olive oil
- 2 cloves garlic, minced
- Salt and pepper to taste

Preheat oven to 400°F. Toss butternut squash with olive oil and garlic in a large bowl. Season with salt and black pepper. Arrange coated squash on a baking sheet. Roast in the preheated oven until squash is tender and lightly browned, 25 to 30 minutes.
